  - o 2 King 14:25 (borders)
  - o Repentance of Nineveh

# **Habakkuk**

- Bio
  - Late 600's BC (pre Babylon invasion)
  - Writing from Judah
- Major Themes
  - o Lament
  - o Judgment on Babylon and any other wicked nation
  - o Faith in God's future goodness
- Fulfilled Prophecy
  - o Fall of Babylon
  - o Restoration of God's people
- Summary
  - o Chapter 1-2a: Conversation between Habakkuk & God
  - o Chapter 2b: 5 Woes
  - o Chapter 3: Habakkuk's Prayer for Israel's future

# Zephaniah

- Bio
  - o During the reign of Josiah (640-609)
- Major Themes
  - Judgment on wicked nations
  - o Judgment on rebellious Jerusalem
  - o Purification of nations, and especially Jerusalem
- Fulfilled Prophecy
  - o Fall of Jerusalem
  - o Fall of enemy nations
  - o Restoration through God for all nations

# **Jeremiah**

- Bio
  - Writes Jeremiah and Lamentations for sure
  - 0 1:1-3
    - Son of a prophet named Hilkiah in the city of Anathoth
    - Started in the 13th year of King Josiah's reign until the exile
      - (627-586 B.C.)
  - Young and resistant (1:6)
  - Prophet to many nations, to both build up and destroy (1:10)
  - Unmarried (16:1-4)
  - o Bad Family relationship (Jeremiah 1:8, 11:21-23, 12:6)
  - Persecution
    - Whipped and put in the stocks (20:1-3), Attacked by a mob (26:1-9), Ridiculed (28) and Threatened by the king (36:26). Some of Zedekiah's princes had Jeremiah beaten, accused of treason, and thrown in jail (37:1-15), they then threw him in a deep empty well (38:1-6).
  - Uses a scribe named Baruch to compile his teachings (36)
  - o Taken to Egypt after fall of Jerusalem, dies here (43)
  - Other biblical references to this time historically
    - 2 Kings 24-25, 2 Chronicles 36
- Themes
  - Judgment on Judah & it's leaders
  - Judgment on nations
  - Idolatry = Adultery
  - o Restoration of Jewish people
  - Hope for all nations
  - Messiah
  - Historical Record
- Fulfilled Prophecy
  - Temple destroyed (7:13-14)

### **Ezekiel**

- Bio
  - Taken to exile in Babylon during 597BC attack on Jerusalem, prophesied from there
    - 2 Kings
    - 597-570 BC
  - Called to be a prophet at 30
    - Age when he would have been called to be a priest
  - Wife dies in exile (Ezekiel 24)
- Major Themes
  - Judgment on Jerusalem that was still to complete
  - o Rebellious/Idolatrous/Adulterous Israel
  - o Hope for Israel and all creation
  - Heavenly Visions
  - Living Parables
  - o God is almighty
- Fulfilled Prophecy
  - o Fall of Jerusalem, Tyre, Egypt and the nations by Bablyon
  - Destruction of the temple
  - Messiah
- Summary
  - o 1-24: Prophecy on Jerusalem's judgment
    - 1-3: Ezekiel commissioned
    - 4-5: Living Parables
    - 6-7: Israel will not listen

## Ezra & Nehemiah

- Bio-Ezra
  - o Around 457 BC
  - Scribe and Priest
  - Leader of the second out of three waves of refugees returning from exile
  - Restored the written Torah in Jerusalem
  - Restored proper worship to the new Temple
- Bio- Nehemiah
  - o Born in exile, served King Artaxerxes I before leading the rebuilding
  - o 52 days to rebuild the first layer of wall under his leadership
  - o 446-445 BC
- Historical Dates
  - o 539 BC Decree of Cyrus
  - o 536 BC- Zerubbabel
  - o 457 BC Ezra
  - o 446 BC -Nehemiah
- Major Themes
  - o Rebuild & Repair
  - Proper worship
  - o Torah
  - Strength of the people following the LORD
- Summary- Ezra
  - Chapter 1 : Decree of Cyrus
  - o Chapter 2: Census of returning exiles
  - o Chapters 3-6: Zerubbabel leads his mission
  - Chapters 7-10: Ezra leads his mission

  - Need for repentance
  - o Restoration
  - Outpouring of God's Spirit
  - Quoting/Referencing scripture
- Fulfilled Prophecy
  - o God's spirit poured out (Pentecost onwards)
  - Judgment on Egypt
- Summary
  - o Chapter 1: Day of the Lord via Locust
  - o Chapter 2:1-17: A future judgment Day of the Lord
  - o Chapter 2:18-27: God's response
  - Chapter 2:28-32: A future restoration of the Lord

## **Haggai**

- Biography
  - Writing during the time of Zerubbabel, 520 BC
  - o Haggai, author of Haggai

  - o Temple rebuilt
  - o Return of Davidic line through Zerubbabel
  - Messiah
- Summary
  - Chapter 1:1-11 Accusation against Jerusalem
  - Chapter 1:12-15 Progress on the temple
  - Chapter 2:1-9 Low expectations addressed
  - o Chapter 2:10-19 Call to return to faithfulness

# Zechariah

- Biography
  - Wrote by Zechariah from 520-470 BC
  - o Grandson of Iddo (Nehemiah 12), son of Berekiah
    - Ezra 5:1, 6:14
  - Probably martyred (Matthew 23:34) but not 100% (2 Chronicles 24:21)
- Key Themes
  - o Salvation is available for all who worship God
  - God is sovereign
  - o Past failures & future hope
  - o Importance of Godly leadership
  - Joy in the Lord and his ways
- Prophecy
  - Tyre loses naval supremacy (9:3)
  - o God will dwell in Jerusalem (8:3)
  - God will work through his Spirit (4:6)
  - Messiah
    - Budding branch (6:12)
    - Riding in on a donkey (9:9)
    - Rejected for 30 silver pieces (11:12)
    - Fights the false leaders (10:3)
    - Cornerstone (10:4)
    - Pierced & died (12:10)
    - Disciples scatter after death (13:7)
- Summary
  - Chapter 1:1-6 Call to Jerusalem to return to the Lord
  - o Chapters 1:7-6:15 Night Visions
